What you'll do

- Offer one-to-one support by phone, video call or email.
- Provide emotional support and encouragement.
- Share your experience of leukaemia (if relevant) to help others feel less alone.
- Signpost people to Leukaemia Care services when needed.

What you'll gain

- The chance to make a real difference in someone's leukaemia journey.
- Training, supervision, and ongoing support from our team.
- Confidence, listening skills, and experience to add to your CV.

Time commitment

- **12 weeks of buddying per person you are matched with**, with ongoing reviews.
- Training before you start, plus regular check-ins with our team.

Who can apply

The role suits people who are:

- ✓ Empathetic and good listeners.
- ✓ Respectful of confidentiality and safeguarding.
- ✓ Over 18 and able to commit to at least one 12-week buddying period.
- ✓ Either with lived experience of leukaemia or with the capacity to give empathetic support.

How we'll support you

- ✓ **Full induction and role-specific training.**
